Jane Amlinger - Vetero

Jane is noted for having one of the best training regimes. As coach Sid Allen once said; "Jane is prepared to do whatever is asked of her". Known for her mental strength, she was a leader on the lanes for Canada during the late 80's and 90's.

Jane's passion for the sport began at an early age. Growing up through the youth programs, Jane was the first Triple Crown

National Champion with titles in Bantam - 1971, Junior - 1975, and Senior 1976.

Consistently winning local and provincial titles at the adult competitions, Jane won the Canadian National Championships in 1988 and 1990. Representing Canada at the Seoul Olympics where bowling was a demonstration sport, Jane finished 4th. She followed up the following year (1989) by winning the World Games title for bowling in the multi sport competition.

1991 became a record-breaking year for Jane, along with team mates Catherine Willis and Anne Saasto as the trio won Canada's first ever World FIQ gold medal in Singapore at the combined men's and women's World Championships.

Jane was a member of Team Canada for ten years. During the 1998 season with team-mate Bill Rowe, the two won a Bronze medal at the Commonwealth Games in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia while setting Canadian records for 8-game and 10-game series.

Rounding out her international competitions, in 1999 Jane was a member of the team that won the WIBC Championship Team title in Florida. A leader for women's bowling in Canada, Jane continues to be a mentor to bowlers young and old across the country.
